MARCH FOR MEALS CELEBRATES A SPECIAL ANNIVERSARY

It's the 50th anniversary of the National Senior **Nutrition Program!**

For the past 20 years, the Meals on Wheels network has claimed the month of March as its time to join forces to strengthen the impact of its efforts and rally communities to bring attention to the service they are providing to seniors. This year, during March for Meals, programs nationwide will celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Older Americans Act (OAA) Nutrition Program alongside our partners at the Administration for Community Living (ACL).

The annual March for Meals celebration commemorates the historic day in March of 1972 when President Nixon signed into law a measure that amended the Older Americans Act to include a national nutrition program for seniors 60 years and older. While this legislation was experiencing delays in becoming a reality, our CAC leaders saw the need to bridge the gap with alternative funding. Local government (Mayor Kyle Testerman) responded to their request for help by awarding \$75,000 in general revenue sharing money to tide the Mobile Meals











program over until funds became available through the OAA amendment.


Our Mobile Meals program celebrated its 50th Anniversary this past fall and has grown from serving its initial 20 seniors to over 1,200 of our elderly neighbors in need. Each year, millions of elderly Americans fall victim to some type of financial fraud or internet scheme. The Internet Crime Complaint

Center (IC3)receives and tracks thousands complaints

by victims of fraud. IC3 reporting is key to identifying, investigating, and holding those responsible accountable for their actions. Join FBI Management and Program Analyst Rachel Yurkovich as she explains how to recognize scams, and how to prevent and report cyber-crimes.

Management and Program Analyst Rachel Yurkovich has been with the FBI for 25 years and with the Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) for 9 of those years. At the IC3, Yurkovich is a point of contact for a variety of cybercrime initiatives, including the DOJ Elder Justice Initiative, Call Center fraud (specifically tech support fraud and IRS/ SSA scams), and mass marketing fraud. Yurkovich is a member of the Global Antifraud Enforcement Network (GAEN) and has represented the FBI at collaborative meetings in the U.S., The Hague, Madrid, and Bern. The GAEN is a concentrated effort to challenge and stop mass marketing fraud occurring worldwide.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR GRANDPARENTS RAISING GRANDCHILDREN

Are you a grandparent or other relative raising a child? If you are, you may be able to claim the Child Tax Credit on behalf of the child you are raising.

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 expands the Child Tax Credit, but only for the tax year 2021. Many grandfamilies and relative caregivers are eligible for this important expanded tax credit.

For the Tax year 2021, the Child Tax Credit has increased to \$3,000 per child for children age 6 up through age 17, and \$3,600 per child for children under age 6. The child is not eligible if they had their 18th birthday in 2021. The credit is fully refundable, which means you can benefit from the credit even if you do not usually file a tax return.

There are basic eligibility criteria you and the child must meet to claim the Child Tax Credit. First, the child must be your relative (cousin is NOT included) or foster child (both related and not related to you). Second, the child must live with you for more than half of the year and you are financially responsible for the child. Third, the



child must have a valid Social Security number.

You may have received the Advance Child Tax Credit payments beginning in July 2021. To be eligible for the Child Tax Credit, you must file a tax return for 2021. To help you file your 2021 taxes, you will need the IRS letter 6914.

If you did not receive any of the Advance Child Tax Credit payments, you still may be eligible for the full amount. You must submit a tax return for 2021

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) is a free and confidential service available to low-income

and moderate-income families. VITA's certified volunteers can also help answer questions about your unique caregiving situation.

- Can I still receive the Child Tax Credit for my grandchildren I am raising?
- What if I do not normally file taxes, can I still file 2021 tax return to receive the Child Tax Credit?
- What if someone else has been claiming my grandchild?

The Grandparents as Parents (GAP) Program is a program of the CAC Office on Aging. We support grandparents and other relative caregivers raising a family member's child. GAP offers a newsletter, support groups, connection to services and resources, case management, a guidebook, and more. GAP is free and there are no income or age requirements. VOLUNTEER ASSISTED TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM CELEBRATES 13 YEARS SERVING THE KNOX COUNTY COMMUNITY

Volunteer Assisted Transportation is a volunteer-driven program of the Knoxville-Knox County Community Action Committee. This unique program utilizes volunteers from the community to volunteer their time to transport and assist seniors and people with disabilities. Volunteers provide door-through-door transportation assistance to those who need help. The program provides professional training and a program vehicle to drive when volunteering.

VAT is excited to celebrate 13 years of keeping seniors more independent. This program allows seniors to stay in their homes longer, as well as be more active and healthier. The program will transport eligible riders to just about any destination. We make sure individuals get to medical appointments, pharmacy and grocery

pick-ups and of course the beauty/barber shop. The program has served more than 2,800 people in its 13 years and travelled more than 800,000 miles total. Collectively, 230 volunteer drivers have stepped up to help provide over 63,000 trips in its 13 years.

Riders and Volunteers may come and go. It is the experiences they have while working with VAT or riding in the vehicles to their destinations that really tells our story.

Our program is a retired nurse who uses her day off to take a man with Alzheimer's to his doctor appointment...

 \dots a retired naval pilot who transports a fellow veteran to the VA hospital \dots

- ... a full-time professional who volunteers after work to pick up groceries for a woman you can no longer get out and about ...
- ... a retired engineer who transports a gentleman to physical therapy 3-days a week . . .
- ... a couple of graduate students from Nepal who find joy in assisting an 89-year young woman to church on Sunday mornings ...

Volunteer Assisted Transportation is a variety of volunteers from different age ranges and backgrounds that share the same common vision - to give back and help their fellow neighbor. All of our volunteers make a lasting impact in the lives they touch. Together we are helping our seniors and people with disabilities to thrive daily.
