BARBARA H. MONTY MOBILE MEALS COMMUNITY KITCHEN

On August 22, friends and family of Barbara H. Monty gathered at the Mobile Meals Kitchen to honor the life of the late Office on Aging director by re-naming the facility. The Barbara H. Monty Mobile Meals Community Kitchen stands as a legacy to a long-time leader who had a vision for a dedicated kitchen to provide healthy meals for homebound seniors in Knox County.

BARBARA H. MONTY: A HISTORY OF SERVICE

It will surprise no one that Barbara Monty's service to CAC began as a volunteer. A graduate of Cornell University and a Registered Dietician, she answered a call in 1968 to help out a CAC program that was struggling with a very limited budget to serve lunch and snacks to poor children in the summer recreation program. After 3 years as a volunteer, Barbara joined the CAC staff on April 16, 1971. CAC had won a national competition through the Office on Economic Opportunity (OEO) to establish a locally developed home delivered meals program which ultimately became Mobile Meals, a group dining program, a home garden program that became Green Thumb Community Garden Program and later Beardsley Farm, and a dental services program for seniors.

It didn't take Barbara long to get things going and the first 20 Mobile Meals were delivered on November 1, 1971. It was clear from the beginning that volunteers would be the life blood of this program. When Barbara retired from CAC on April 13, 2013, 41 years to the day she started, more than 7,300,000 meals had been delivered by a corps of dedicated volunteers.

Barbara became director of the CAC Office on Aging in 1977. CAC executive director, Barbara Kelly, likes to say, "Barbara's mantra might well be: See a need, meet it; see a problem, fix it." When Barbara retired,

the Office on Aging had become a focal point for comprehensive services for seniors, providing more than 20 programs to meet a complex range of human need. The programs continue today as a lasting legacy to her tenacity, energy, and compassion.

The Knoxville—Knox County Community Action Committee acknowledges with deep appreciation the generosity and devotion of Barbara H. Monty and Dr. Kenneth Monty in establishing an endowment fund to help support the essential work of the CAC Office on Aging and CAC Knox County Transit in the years to come. ■

ENROLLMENT CONTINUES FOR PROPERTY TAX RELIEF AND TAX FREEZE PROGRAMS

Ed Shouse, Knox County Trustee, is encouraging eligible property owners to apply for the Tax Relief and Tax Freeze Programs. "The 2018 property tax statements were mailed in October. Even if you've paid your property taxes, you can still apply. The state of Tennessee offers these two, money-saving programs for homeowners." stated Knox County Trustee, Ed Shouse. "The income limits were increased from last year so that we may include more homeowners. My office is here to assist with the application process."

The Knox County Trustee's office administers the two programs benefiting low-income seniors (65 and up), low-income disabled homeowners and disabled veterans (total and permanent) and their widows(ers). "Our greatest challenge is communicating the details of the programs and

the requirement to renew annually. One of my goals as Trustee is to get the word out." stated Mr. Shouse. Programs apply to homeowner's primary residence, and applications must be completed between October 1, 2018 and April 5, 2019. Applicants are encouraged to apply well before the deadline to allow for review and completion. Having a mortgage is not a factor with either program.

Tax Freeze is open to homeowners age 65 and up, with a 2017 household income limit of \$39,330. Proof of 2017 income required. If eligible, the property tax amount will be frozen for the homeowner. Participants must re-qualify each year.

Tax Relief is open to homeowners age 65+, or total and permanent disabled, or total

and permanent disabled veterans and their widows(ers). Household income limit is \$29,270 (and does not apply to veterans and their widows). Proof of 2017 income required. Property taxes must be paid in full prior to application. Knox County tax relief amount is \$146 for elderly and disabled, and up to \$928 for disabled veterans. Additional Tax relief is available to homeowners that live in the city. You may also visit the Knox County website at http://www.knoxcounty.org/trustee/taxrelief.php or the State website at www.comptroller. tn.gov/pa/patxr.asp.

Applications available on line and at any Knox County Trustee location (downtown, East at Isaiah's Landing, North at Cross Roads Center (Halls), South at Chapman Plaza, West at Cedar Bluff and at Farragut Towne Hall). Documentation (including proof of age and income of all owners) is required.
