SAVINGS CHECK UP MAKES THE MOST OF YOUR BENEFITS

Are you on Medicare? Do you need extra money for medicine, groceries, or utilities? The Office on Aging's Savings Check Up can help you maximize your benefits and ease the strain on your budget. Staff uses web based-tools and person-centered approaches to help low-income seniors and persons with disabilities find and enroll in all the benefits programs for which they are eligible, and create coordinated, community-wide systems of benefits access.

Question: Everything is so expensive! I keep hearing about programs to help cover the costs of groceries, Medicare & even utilities. Do these really exist?

Answer: Yes! The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) is designed to help people put nutritious food on their table. The Medicare Saving Program (MSP) pays Medicare Part B premiums for eligible beneficiaries, and the Extra Help program (also known as LIS) helps pay the costs of Part D premiums and co-pays. LIHEAP is designed to provide assistance to eligible households for their home energy costs.

Question: That's great, but how do you know if you're eligible for any of these programs?

Answer: Good news! The National Council on Aging (NCOA) has recently named the Knoxville - Knox County CAC Office on Aging a Benefits **Enrollment Center** (BEC). What does that mean? It means the Office on Aging is now able to offer SAVINGS CHECK UPS. If you are interested in seeing if you qualify for any of these money saving programs, you can call the Savings Check Up program at (865) 546-6262. Staff or a trained volunteer will ask you a few basic questions and

complete a screening to see if you may qualify. If you prefer to look into it on your own, you can visit www.benefitscheckup.org, answer a few simple questions and get information on what programs you may be eligible for.

Question: What happens if it looks like I might qualify for something?

Answer: If it looks like you may qualify for SNAP, MSP, LIS, LIHEAP or any other benefit programs, and you would like help to complete the applications, Savings Check Up staff and volunteers are available for appointments to help you complete and submit the appropriate



paperwork. They can help explain the different programs, what is required for applications, help complete the paperwork and



follow-up with you if you have any questions once receiving benefits. In addition to the "core benefits" described above, Savings Check Up will also look into other benefits you may qualify for and help navigate applying for those as well.

THERE'S AN APP FOR THAT! MARCH FOR MEALS

CAC Mobile Meals participates in the national March for Meals campaign, which is an annual month-long event designed to generate public awareness about senior hunger and isolation. Mobile Meals celebrates the services they provide to local seniors such as home-delivered and congregate meals.

On Friday, March 29, Community Champions such as local mayors, County Commissioners, City Council, and others will gather at the Mobile Meals Kitchen to pair up with volunteers and deliver meals.

Knox County has been selected as one of ten Meals on Wheels in the country to use a new app. Volunteers who have the app on their smart phone are able to use mapping technology to locate their clients and immediately report back to staff of any change in the client's



condition. This process will help us to be "more than a meal" for homebound seniors.

Five days a week, more than 100 volunteers deliver hot, nutritious meals to 925 homebound seniors in Knoxville and Knox County. Just as important, volunteers provide a daily safety check to make sure the seniors are comfortable and safe.
