
pets show improvement in their health and overall happiness. We hope you can join us to raise funds for this program that makes a real difference in the lives of many Knox County seniors.

In addition to semi-annual Senior Job Fairs, the Senior Employment Service offers a number of services to seniors who are looking for employment, including job search assistance and individualized job counseling. All services are free of charge.




